## Spring Season

### New concession stand

The spring season was a great overall success. The Town of Ariton improved the capital grounds by converting Batting Cage #2 into a concession stand with covered seating. While it is an ongoing project, the new concession stand has provided much needed space for concessions and cooking, and added additional restroom facilities in a more central location in the park. With the loss of a batting cage to our new concession stand, the Commission purchased a portable batting cage to erect behind Laney-Miller Field 1. This will serve as an additional resource to coaches and teams until a new permanent batting cage is constructed.

Dedication of new Terry-Hughes Field 3

At our opening day ceremony, the Mayor and Town Council dedicated the multi-purpose field, naming it Terry-Hughes Field 3. The field is a work in progress, and our plan is to eventually have lights installed, a new scoreboard, bleachers and even expansion to a full-size football field.

#### First annual Hit-a-Thon!

The Spring Committee launched a fun and successful fundraising event - the first annual Hit-a-thon. We raised \$4,219 in one day and plan to make it a recurring event!

With the increased registrations year-over-year, the spring season realized a larger profit than in years past - even after the purchase of a new batting cage and other one-time expenses were factored in. This is only made possible with a dedicated Committee and committed parents. Thank you!

### The Champions Wall

Last year saw the construction of our Champions Wall. We retroactively recognized the first ever Ariton Parks and Recreation teams to compete at the State Championship. In 2023 we saw two more teams compete at the State level, and their competition will be recognized on the Champions Wall this year!

### Football Safety Equipment

Our initial plan was to purchase new helmets in a three-year phased approach. The Commission approved the purchase of 20 helmets each year, beginning in 2023, and continuing until all helmets were replaced. Thanks to the hard work of our coaches and Fall Committee, we were able to purchase all 65 of the helmets in 2023. This is a substantive improvement in the safety of our participants and quality of our equipment, enhancing the improvements made by purchasing all new shoulder pads in 2022.

### Two Super Bowls - One season

With our second full season of flag football, we've seen an increase in interest and participation. Our Commission added a commissioner dedicated to the flag football program. We were selected to host our first Flag Football Super Bowl this year, further contributing to the success of the program.

2023 was also our year to host the tackle football Super Bowl. Thanks to the Fall Committee, coaches, parents and community volunteers, we closed out the season in a big way!

Every year our cheerleaders participate in a cheer competition held by the Pea River Football Association. This year our Pee-Wee cheerleaders brought home the title of champions, while our Termite cheerleaders were first runner-up. Congratulations ladies!

### Purple Cat Classic

Our basketball sports participation has increased every year since our inaugural season in 2019. In 2023 we hosted our first Purple Cat Classic - an area-wide, all-day tournament that showcases our kids' athletic
