# Spring Season

### All-Star Tournaments

The 12U - Ozone boys team led by Coaches Matt Murphy and Blake Wise competed in the State All-Star tournament. While they came up short of the title, our boys gave it their all and represented the community of Ariton well.

Ariton was the host of the 8U AA Diamond Youth District tournament. It was a long weekend, but because of the dedication of our Spring Committee and parents to work the gates and concession stand, we were able to raise over \$6,000.

#### New Pitching Mounds

Our program was able to take our budget surplus from the season and purchase two Porta-Lite fiberglass pitching mounds. Each mound is designed with a full body, high performance poly protected resilient core with fiberglass reinforcement giving the pitcher a solid, no bounce, yet cushioned baseball mound that reduces knee and ankle strain.

### Concession Stand improvements

Our parents and fans have thoroughly enjoyed the addition of our new concession stand. This year, thanks to the Agriculture class at Ariton School, we were able to add picnic tables in the pavilion area. Also, many thanks to Johnston Trucking for the crushed rock that was donated for the pavilion as well. Additionally, the Town of Ariton installed durable privacy stalls in the bathrooms.

### Fall Season

#### Fundraiser success

The Cheer participants held a Dine & Donate fundraiser in September. A portion of the proceeds from customers dining at DiFillipo's in Ozark were donated to our Cheer program. We raised \$477!

The Football participants raffled off a Yeti cooler in October. The net gains of the raffle to the prgram was \$1,137!

This year marks the third season we've provided flag football competition. Every year we've seen growth in interest and participation. Our first year we started with two 6U teams. Last year we dedicated a Commissioner to oversee the program. This year we expanded to provide two 8U teams as well.
